SLAVERY

Slavery is illegal almost everywhere— but today millions of children, women and men are trapped in slavery around the world.

Traffickers and slave holders use deception, threats or violence to force people into grueling labor or sexual exploitation for little or no pay. These individuals are often denied adequate food or sleep, and they're often barred from leaving for school or medical care.

IJM addresses labor trafficking, sex trafficking and cybersex trafficking in communities around the world. In India, entire families are enslaved working in brick kilns, rice mills, garment factories and other places—some up to 20 hours per day. In Europe, many fall victim to trafficking in persons as law enforcement across the region struggle to unify efforts to combat the issue across borders. In the Philippines, cybersex trafficking—the live-streaming of sexual exploitation, oftentimes of very young children—is on the rise in the digital age.

Labor Trafficking on Lake Volta

IJM Ghana works with local law enforcement to rescue teenagers like Godwin, who was trafficked into life-threatening work on Lake Volta. After being taken to safety, Godwin twice returned to the island with police to help them identify other trafficked children and bring them to safety as well. He is now back in school pursuing his dream to become a doctor.

OUR SOLUTION

In the face of abuse, IJM and our partners collaborate with local authorities to build communities where all people can expect to be safe and protected. Together, we:

Strengthen Justice Systems

We offer training for government officials combating slavery, equipping them sensitively and proactively respond to cases of slavery. Together, we design improvements that serve survivors and deter other potential traffickers.

Rescue and Restore Victims

We identify brothels, homes, factories, fishing boats and farms where people are trafficked, and partner with local police to conduct rescue operations. We then walk with survivors on the path to restoration, developing care plans focusing on physical health, trauma counseling and economic self-sufficiency.

Bring Criminals to Justice

We work alongside justice system officials to build strong cases against traffickers and hold them accountable under local laws. We aid public prosecutors by collecting evidence and researching legal precedents.

Scale Demand for Protection

We convene and equip champions—from grassroots community leaders and survivors of trafficking to global corporations and development institutions—to call on governments to protect people from slavery.
